Put up flannel picture of Jesus with a bowl, sheep and dove. Leave up until you are finished with next two pages: sheep and dove.

Walk the sheep around and let each child feel how soft.

Jesus' family might have had doves that lived in their barn. Jesus would sprinkle grain or bird seed on the ground for the doves to eat. He was glad that he was big enough to help feed the doves.

Give each child a dove fingerpuppet. Lead them in pretending to fly all around and then come down and peck at the food that Jesus has sprinkled on the ground.

Put up flannels of Jesus and Joseph with tools.

Demonstrate how to hammer and that we only hammer between our own legs. Pass out a hammer and block and let each child hammer. See if you can get them to hammer to the song.

Pass out a bowl and spoon for each child. Pretend to mix bread.
